Greetings Brethren,

Now that we are getting back to normal operations, we are going to start getting caught up on the backlog of degrees. We have put together a 3rd degree team and will be staring practices on Saturday March 18 at 10:15 am. We will be practicing twice a month, every first Saturday and Last Thursday of the month.

Here are the dates:

Saturday April 1 at 10:15 am / Thursday April 27 at 6:30 pm

Saturday May 6 at 10:15 am / Thursday May 25 at 6:30 pm

Saturday June 3rd at 10:15 am [Invite Scott C (inspector) to see us do degree.]

3rd Degrees: Thursday Jun 29 Alex Terrill at 7:00 pm / Saturday July 8 Josh Weigum at 10:15 am

The goal is to get the first two of our Fellowcrafts raised to the sublime degree of master mason between the last week of June and the first week in July. The first one will be Alex Terill on Thursday, June 29 followed by Josh Weigum on Saturday, July 8. If more Fellowcrafts qualify, we will set up more degree dates after the 8th. Lastly, we may throw in a few more Master Mason degrees by the middle of November if more Fellow crafts complete their proficiencies

The next degrees in line will be Fellowcrafts. We have a back log of Entered Apprentices that need to do their Fellowcraft degrees. I would like to organize those for the last week in August. All entered apprentices should get together with their coaches and start getting ready to do their proficiencies. Line officers should start reviewing their parts as well.

To date, we have no new candidates to be initiated, however, I encourage our line officers to be reviewing their parts for the 1st degree as well.

By the time this is published we will have had our first planning meeting for next year. A lot is on the table to try and improve the operations of our lodge. With our new lineup of officers, we will have filled in the gaps we have needed to keep a steady succession for at least the next 4 years. Now that the pandemic is behind us, it is time to look forward and rebuild our lodge. We still need two more people to stand up and help us out.

Masonic Do's and Don'ts

LODGE ROOM ETIQUETTE

- When addressing the Master in Lodge always rise, give the appropriate Masonic sign and say "Worshipful Master" before speaking.
- During open lodge, if it is necessary to walk to the East, never walk or cross between the altar and the Master's chair, always approach on either the North or South side of the Master.
- Cell phones should **NEVER** be used when lodge is open and should always be on silent mode. Use of a phone is distracting and disrespectful to the Master, Brethren and Candidate.

"If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God" – James 1:5

What is wisdom? Is it intelligence? Knowledge? Understanding? Are these three one and the same? Wisdom can be defined as a multifaceted concept that encompasses a deep understanding of life, the world, and oneself. It is the ability to make sound judgements and decisions based on experience, knowledge, and intuition. Wisdom involves a capacity for critical thinking, emotional intelligence, and empathy. It also encompasses a sense of humility, a willingness to learn from one's mistakes, and a commitment to personal growth and development.

In essence, wisdom is the result of a lifetime of learning, observation, and reflection. It is a quality that is often associated with older individuals (maybe our parents really did know something!), who have accumulated a wealth of knowledge and experience over time. However, wisdom can be cultivated at any age by cultivating the qualities and skills that are associated with it, such as self-awareness, empathy, and critical thinking.

How do we gain wisdom? As can be read above, time, experience, and the capacity to learn are fundamental for gaining knowledge. Here are some examples and techniques one can utilize in furthering one's knowledge:

- **Experience:** "Experience is the best teacher". Each experience, positive or negative, provides an opportunity to learn and grow.
- **Learning from others:** Listening to others' experiences and insights, seeking out mentors and role models, reading books/articles, attending lectures/workshops.
- **Reflection:** Reflecting on your experiences or actions can help you gain a deeper understanding of yourself and the work around you; you learn from your mistakes and successes.
- **Developing critical thinking skills:** Critical thinking skills help you to evaluate information and make sound judgements. Developing critical thinking skills involves asking questions (it is okay to ask questions!), considering multiple perspectives (maybe we are wrong, gasp!), and analyzing evidence.
- **Cultivating emotional intelligence:** Emotional intelligence involves the ability to identify, understand, and manage your own emotions and the emotions of others. It includes skills such as empathy self-awareness, and emotional regulation. All of which are essential for developing wisdom.
- **Practicing humility:** How many of us have trouble being humble, especially when we are wrong? Or when we can flaunt being right? Humility is an important component of wisdom. It involves recognizing that you do not know everything and being open to learning from others. Practice humility by acknowledging your mistakes and being willing to learn from them.

Masonic Lodge Officer Duties and Responsibilities



His Jewel is the **Square and Compass with the Sun in the middle**. The sun signifies that his position is on the lower level, to the right of the Worshipful Master in the east.

His duty is as messenger of the Worshipful Master, hence he does a lot of walking.

The Senior Deacon of a Masonic Lodge is an assistant officer of the Lodge. The Senior Deacon's principle roles are to welcome and escort both visitors and candidates into the lodge and introduce distinguished visitors.

It is his duty to assist the Worshipful Master and carry orders between the Worshipful Master and the Senior Warden. During degree rituals, he guides the new candidate and conducts him around the lodge room.

During the opening and closing ceremonies, the Senior Deacon opens the Holy Scriptures to the correct passage of the degree being worked and closes it after the lodge is adjourned. He also lights and extinguishes the candles at the altar.


He carries the ballot box around the lodge when new members are being voted upon.

The Senior Deacon's position is similar to a Manager. The Senior Deacon (and the Junior Deacon) both carry long staffs (or rods), because as messengers of the Worshipful Master, the staffs are symbolic of the caduceus (or wand) that the Roman winged god and messenger Mercury carried during their duties. Atop the rods are the jewels of their offices.
