ANNUAL MASONIC CONFERENCE

Most legislation will not affect Lodi Lodge. Of the nine resolutions, 3 passed, 3 failed and 3 will be voted on again next year as carry overs.

The 3 failed were:

- 1) Increasing limit from \$25,000 to \$50,000 for building changes without submitting documents to Temple Properties Committee.
- 2) Allowing a man to be Secretary of more than one lodge
- 3) Counting a man's years as a Mason from initiation rather than when he becomes a Master Mason.




MORE MASONIC CHANGES THROUGH THE YEARS

Unless you served as Master in the 1980's most of us would not know that during the Annual Communications of 1983 legislation reduced some of the memory work for the Master by shortening the lecture in the First Degree. Many lessons were lost because of this but now some Masters are exemplifying that degree in the original long form version. Much of the missing information is in the Monitor and Officers' Manual which we all received.

While almost everyone is now familiar with the Cipher Ritual, it wasn't a reality until 1988. The selling point to pass that legislation was that it should be used as "an aid to the memory" although many officers today find themselves lost without it. Interesting that both the Jurisprudence and Legislative Analysis committees recommended a "NO" vote on this change to adopt the Cipher. The power of the voting delegates passed the Resolution. I still believe "mouth-to-ear" is the best way to learn our ritual.
